## **ENTSOG publishes new edition of Transmission Capacity Map**

(Brussels, 10 June, PR111-16) ENTSOG publishes a new edition of the European Natural Gas Network map. The 2016 edition shows the updated capacities at cross-border points on the primary market.

The Transmission Capacity Map provides the most extensive and accurate overview of the transmission capacities currently offered in the European gas systems. The displayed data as of 1 January 2016 is a key element of the 2017 Ten-Year Network Development Plan.

Particular care has been taken to correctly reflect, using a simple colour scheme, whether the points offer physically bidirectional or virtual backhaul capacity. Convergence with the Transparency Platform has increased in terms of naming conventions, coding schemes and the data itself.

Jan Ingwersen, ENTSOG General Manager, said, "We are happy to say that information available as well as the accuracy of data has been improved compared to the last edition."
