ENTSOG publishes its Annual Report 2017 and reports for Network Code and Guidelines Implementation and Effect Monitoring for 2017

(Brussels, 11 June, PR0162-18) ENTSOG publishes its Annual Report 2017 and four implementation and effect monitoring reports.

A significant milestone for ENTSOG and its members was achieved in 2017 – the Tariff Network Code, the last network code foreseen for the time being, was published.

With respect to the revised Security of Supply Regulation adopted and published in October 2017, ENTSOG cooperated with its Members to further develop the Regional Coordination (ReCo) System for Gas and in November 2017 ENTSOG published the first edition of the Union-wide Security of Supply Simulation report.

It was also a busy year for ENTSOG in terms of investment planning, infrastructure assessment and scenario development for the EU energy system. In addition to the Ten-Year Network Development Plan (TYNDP) 2017 being published, ENTSOG and ENTSO-E worked together to develop joint scenarios for each respective TYNDP 2018 - a good step for building common understanding of possible synergies between electricity and gas sectors

Jan Ingwersen, ENTSOG General Manager, said, "ENTSOG will continue to monitor the implementation of all applicable market, infrastructure, security of supply and transparency legislation, and bring well-founded, balanced and practical experience of its Members into the discussions and processes".

In parallel, new monitoring reports on the network codes and guidelines have been made available. These reports show the implementation as well as the effects of the Congestion





Management Procedure Guidelines, the Balancing Network Code, the Interoperability Network Code and the Capacity Allocation Mechanism Network Code.
