ENTSOG publishes Project-Specific CBA (PS-CBA) package of documents for draft TYNDP 2020

(Brussels, 12 January, PR0228-21) Today, ENTSOG publishes the project-specific CBA (PS-CBA) package of documents as part of the ENTSOG draft Ten Year Network Development Plan (TYNDP) 2020.

The TYNDP 2020 project-specific assessment has been performed following the approved 2nd CBA Methodology (available here), to ensure:

- The assessment of projects on a comparable basis
- Consistent results to be provided to promoters
- Increased transparency for stakeholders on the projects' assessment.

On that basis, results are published in the TYNDP 2020 in the form of a "Project Fiche". This follows the publication of the TYNDP 2020 System Assessment Report which identifies potential investment needs in the European gas system.

For the first time, ENTSOG's TYNDP 2020 includes Energy Transition Related projects, and consequently, as part of TYNDP 2020 PS-CBA package ENTSOG includes a Sustainability assessment for ETR projects included in TYNDP 2020.

The PS-CBA package of documents is available on the ENTSOG website, <u>here</u>. The package includes:

- List of project groups on which ENTSOG has carried out the PS-CBA
- Introduction on how to read the Project Fiches
- The PS-CBA Project Fiches
- Tables of the Project Fiches in Excel format
- Sustainability assessment for Energy Transition projects

The publication of the PS-CBA documents allows the provision of technical support to promoters, while also ensuring a level-playing field and a transparent assessment for all stakeholders.





Presenting the cost-benefit analysis of projects using a standardised template ensures relevant project information and PS-CBA results are provided in a harmonised, concise, and comparable manner.
