## ENTSOG publishes its Transmission Capacity Map 2021

(Brussels, 5 November 2021, PR0257-21) ENTSOG has today published a new edition of its Transmission Capacity map, providing an overview of Europe's main high pressure transmission lines and providing information on technical capacity at cross-border points.

The Transmission Capacity Map 2021 provides a comprehensive overview of the transmission capacities offered in the European gas systems as of 1 January 2021.

The map provides information on technical capacity at cross-border points on the primary market, indicating for each whether the point offers a physically bidirectional or virtual backhaul capacity, by using a simple colour code scheme. Additionally, the different trading points and virtualised points are represented. The map content is developed based on operational information available on the <u>ENTSOG Transparency Platform</u> and is aligned in terms of naming conventions, coding schemes and the data itself.
