## ENTSOG reopens project collection for its Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2022

(Brussels, 24 May, PR0274-22) ENTSOG will reopen the project collection process for its Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2022 (TYNDP 2022) on 30 May 2022.

The TYNDP, published every two years, provides an overview of the European gas infrastructure and assesses the development of the gas grid and new gas facilities within the next years. The basis for this exercise is an up-to-date collection of projects with European relevance, due to their contribution to a resilient network and / or support of the European energy transition.

Following the commencement of new infrastructure initiatives aiming to reduce Russian gas supply dependence, e.g., the RePower EU Plan published by the European Commission on 18 May, ENTSOG will reopen the project collection process between **30 May and 24 June 2022** to ensure a comprehensive and up-to-date overview of all projects.

Reopening the project collection process provides project promoters the opportunity to submit any project not yet considered in the current list of TYNDP 2022 projects. Furthermore, project promoters are also invited to update their already existing project data submissions. Submission is possible via an <u>online questionnaire</u> and, for new project promoters, login credentials can be provided by the ENTSOG team.

Project promoters can submit information related to any of the TYNDP 2022 project categories. All submitted projects are required to comply with specific administrative and technical criteria for their inclusion, as defined in the "ENTSOG Practical implementation document (PID) for developing the TYNDP 2022", available here.

Further supporting material is provided in the ENTSOG's Documentation KIT (available <a href="here">here</a>). Please note that all the timelines indicated in the PID and in the supporting documents have not been updated and still refer to the first project collection in November 2021.
