ENTSOG invites stakeholders to participate at its draft TYNDP 2022 workshop on 25 April 2023

(Brussels, 17 April 2023, PR0291-23) Stakeholder consultation for the draft TYNDP 2022 commenced on 11 April and will continue until 19 May 2023. For the first time, this 'Hydrogen and Natural Gas TYNDP' includes a dual gas system modelling approach that considers hydrogen and methane networks simultaneously, following contrasted scenarios reflecting the European climate and energy ambitions.

The TYNDP 2022 (Executive Summary, Reports and Annexes) was published on 11 April and is available for review at the ENTSOG website, <u>here</u>. **Stakeholders can provide feedback using the public <u>feedback form</u> until 19 May 2023.**

To assist with gathering stakeholder feedback during the consultation process, ENTSOG is organising a workshop to present and exchange views on the draft TYNDP 2022 on **25 April from 10:00 to 13:00 CET**. This workshop will be in hybrid format and stakeholders are asked to indicate their intention to join in-person at the ENTSOG office, or online, during registration.
