ENTSOG publishes the list of projects to be included in its Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2024

(Brussels, 18 June, PR0323-24) Today, ENTSOG published the list of projects to be included in its Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2024 (TYNDP 2024), as required by Annex III.2 (4) TEN-E Regulation (EC) 869/2022. Submission to ENTSOG's TYNDP 2024 is a prerequisite for Projects of Common Interest/Projects of Mutual Interest (PCI/PMI) application for hydrogen infrastructure projects.

The basis for the TYNDP is an up-to-date collection of projects with European relevance, due to their contribution to a resilient network and support to the European energy transition.

Following the usual TYNDP timeline, ENTSOG updated its project selection criteria for hydrogen and natural gas infrastructure in TYNDP 2024. An overview description and technical definitions for all project categories are available in the TYNDP 2024 <u>Final Guidelines for Project Inclusion</u> (GPI). An informative webinar on the project submission process was hosted by ENTSOG in November 2023, to assist promoters with project submissions, and allow for feedback and address any questions.

Of the 326 projects included in TYNDP 2024, 202 directly refer to the development of a hydrogen system by producing, injecting and transporting hydrogen. 152 hydrogen projects were submitted in TYNDP 2022.

Piotr Kuś, ENTSOG General Director, commented, "This list of projects for TYNDP 2024 highlights two important trends: a significant increase in hydrogen projects since the previous TYNDP cycle and a decrease of natural gas projects submitted – 95 projects in this list compared to 149 projects in the TYNDP 2022. This clearly shows the progress made in the planning of infrastructure for the Energy Transition."

Furthermore, 29 projects have been submitted as part of other sub-categories, including Smart Gas Grid and CO₂ infrastructure.
