ENTSOG publishes draft TYNDP 2024 Natural Gas System Assessment & Infrastructure Reports and opens stakeholder consultation

(Brussels, 11 June, PR0346-25) Today, ENTSOG published two draft Ten-Year Network Development Plan (TYNDP) 2024 documents – the Natural Gas System Assessment Report and the Infrastructure Report – and opened consultation for stakeholder feedback until 30 June 2025. The documents are established in line with Article 26 of Regulation (EU) 2024/1798 (as part of the Hydrogen and Decarbonised Gas Market Package) and with Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2022/869 (the 'TEN-E' Regulation).

For the first time, ENTSOG is publishing hydrogen and natural gas system-level assessments as separate, self-standing documents as part of its TYNDP. This <u>draft Natural Gas System Assessment report</u> complements ENTSOG's draft <u>TYNDP 2024 Hydrogen Infrastructure Gaps Identification report</u>. For an integrated sector perspective, the two reports can be read alongside ENTSO-E's Identification of System Needs (IoSN) Report.

The Natural Gas System Assessment is the result of European-wide simulations, primarily aimed at assessing the resilience of infrastructure projected in 2030 and 2040. This is done in practice by measuring curtailment under different stress-case scenarios. In support of the report, a user-friendly <u>visualisation platform</u> is available, together with report datasets, presented in the TYNDP 2024 <u>Annex E – Analysis tables</u>.

The Infrastructure Report, one of the main TYNDP documents, provides a detailed overview of the future network, starting from its current configuration and representing infrastructure on the TYNDP 2024 list (Annex A). The <u>draft Infrastructure report</u> was first published for information in December 2024 and is now subject to consultation.

ENTSOG invites stakeholders to provide written feedback on the reports and supporting materials until **30 June 2025**, though this public consultation questionnaire. ENTSOG will consider the





feedback to finalise the materials, intended for submission to ACER for its Opinion as part of the final TYNDP 2024 set of documents.

As part of the consultation process, interested stakeholders are invited to join a dedicated online event, on **23 June 2025**, at which the content of the draft documents will be presented and stakeholder questions addressed. Registration is possible via the event page.

ENTSOG welcomes feedback in particular from stakeholders such as: the EU DSO entity, associations involved in electricity, gas and hydrogen markets, heating and cooling, carbon capture and storage and carbon capture and utilisation stakeholders, independent aggregators, demand-response operators, organisations involved in energy efficiency solutions, energy consumer associations, civil society representatives, the European Commission and Member States' representatives.
