

Press Release ENTSOG opens stakeholder consultation on its draft Annual Work Programme (AWP) 2026

(Brussels, 14 July, PR0347-25) **Today, ENTSOG launched a public consultation on its Annual Work Programme 2026 and is inviting stakeholders to contribute in defining the right priorities and to identify the most relevant projects for ENTSOG in 2026. The consultation remains open until 5 September 2025**.

Piotr Kuś, ENTSOG General Director, said, "ENTSOG's tasks in 2026 span more than just those required by regulation. For example, we will work to address the requests arising from two energy regulatory fora in Madrid and Copenhagen in 2025, to develop a mid-term infrastructure assessment framework, implementation of the Interlinked Model in TYNDP 2026 and development of possible de-risking options for hydrogen projects. As ever, we look forward to continued collaboration with ENNOH, ENTSO-E and other relevant stakeholders on joint tasks, and to address the needs of the Clean Industrial Deal with all stakeholders. We welcome your feedback on the draft Annual Work Programme 2026."
