ENTSOG commences project collection for the Ten-Year Network Development Plan (TYNDP) 2026

(Brussels, 29 September, PR0349-25) Today, ENTSOG commenced the project collection process for the Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2026 (TYNDP 2026). Project promoters should submit their projects during the 'Project Submission Phase' between 29 September and 26 October 2025.

Project promoters who have already submitted their projects for TYNDP 2024 are required to re-submit their projects and provide up-to-date data to allow their projects to be considered. Submission is possible via an <u>online questionnaire</u>. Login credentials can be provided by contacting the ENTSOG team.

Project promoters can make a submission using the following project subcategories:

- For Hydrogen infrastructure projects:
 - (i) Hydrogen transmission pipelines (H2T)
 - (ii) Hydrogen storage facilities (H2S)
 - (iii) Hydrogen reception facilities (H2L)
 - (iv) Hydrogen in the transport sector for mobility (H2M)
 - (v) Electrolysers for hydrogen production (H2E)
- For Natural Gas infrastructure projects:
 - (i) Gas transmission pipelines (TRA)
 - (ii) Underground storage facilities (UGS)
 - (iii) Reception and storage and regasification or decompression facilities for liquefied natural gas (LNG)
- For Smart Gas Grid infrastructure projects:
 - (i) Retrofitting projects to integrate hydrogen blends (RET)
 - (ii) Biomethane development projects (BIO)
 - (iii) Synthetic methane projects (SYN)



- For Others project categories:
 - (i) Repurposing of natural gas infrastructure for CO2 transport and/or storage (CO2)
 - (ii) Other infrastructure related projects (OTH)

All submitted projects are required to comply with specific administrative and technical criteria for their inclusion, as defined in the 'ENTSOG Final Guidelines for Project inclusion (GPI) for TYNDP 2026', available here.
