Project plan consultation feedback

- Preparatory work allowed for two weeks consultation
 - Late responses received have been treated to ensure maximum adherence to the process
- 34 stakeholder reactions received
 - All have been published, with ENTSOG view on each relevant comment
- General feeling from the consultation
 - Strong emphasis on stakeholder involvement is appreciated
 - Proposed balance between interactive code development and formal consultation supported
 - Planning considered credible given the tight time-scale

Specific remarks _{1/2}

Emphasis on stakeholders involvement

- Possibility to extensively meet with ENTSOG emphasised throughout the process
 - "Formal" SJWSs planned and bilateral sessions always welcomed
 - ENSTOG welcomes the continuous dialogue with all stakeholders
 - Timing must be considered to ensure fair and transparent treatment

Impact of ACER parallel work on FG

- Visibility on potential impact of ACER work is requested
- ENTSOG has been commissioned to work based on ERGEG's document.
 - Assuming parallel ACER work will not introduce significant changes impacting the timely delivery of the NC
 - Should this be the case, process and timing will have to be revised
 - Issue is discussed with EC accordingly



Specific remarks 2/2

Comprehensive and equal treatment of voiced opinions


- Stakeholders ask for a detailed analysis of their comments and a fair treatment regardless their respective market position
 - ENTSOG will treat all parties equally
 - Project foresees a consultation report with in depth analysis of the responses
 - Fairness also lies in the possibility to openly address contradictory opinions.
 This is best achieved as early as possible and during interactive design

Emphasis on stakeholders communication

- Relevant material made timely, easily, transparently, accessible via the website
 - This is the objective of ENTSOG
 - Final plan will be amended to include a section on document management policy via the website

• Engagement of the market is critical for the NC development

1	6	Prime Mover	Committed to work on a bilateral basis and dedicate a lot of resources to assist formulate and evaluate/refine ideas/proposals for SJWS consideration – commitment to be intensive and involving many days during intensive phases of the network code development
2	18	Active SJWS Participant	Expected to attend all SJWS and to read and review all material prior to meetings and to be prepared to explore detail within the SJWS – commitment of around 3 days per month during intensive period of activity
3	8	Consultation Respondent	Will respond to consultations
4	2	Inactive	Expected not to actively contribute to the development effort or to participate in the formal consultations



Active SJWS participants 1/2

- Expected to:
 - attend all SJWS
 - read and review all material prior to meetings
 - be prepared to explore detail within the SJWS"

Active participants should enable proposals to reflect a balanced assessment of the needs of the full range of stakeholders



Active SJWS participants 2/2

- Role:
 - To ensure high quality of draft network code
 - To ensure wide range of expert views as inputs
 - To come prepared to SJWS to engage, to listen and to inform best way forward

- Engagement
 - Commitment of around 3 days per month during intensive period of activity



Prime Movers 1/1

- Committed to
 - work on a bilateral basis
 - dedicate a lot of resources to assist formulate and evaluate/refine ideas/proposals for SJWS consideration
 - commitment to be intensive and involving many days during intensive phases
 of the network code development
 - Must provide industry wide perspectives on the subject matter
 - [Chattam House Rule]

Prime Movers must be committed to provide early views and feedback to enable high quality proposals for SJWS / network code given limited development time



Prime Movers 1/1

- Role: like active SJWS participants plus:
 - To provide a small team to engage additionally outside of the SJWS
 - To provide timely feedback to inform preparation for SJWS / network code
 - May act as contact points/communication channel for other stakeholders

- Engagement
 - > 3 days per month
