

ENTSOG's view on Commission's CMP Guideline Proposal

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Restriction of re-nomination rights

- TSO data suggests that proposed restriction of re-nomination rights will have a negative effect on shippers and end users
 - Shippers make extensive use of re-nomination at a wide range of IPs, beyond limits proposed in CMP guideline
 - Potential security of supply issues in electricity
 - Small shippers disproportionately affected
- The following slides show examples of actual re-nomination behaviour

Data shows that shippers make use of re-nomination rights to provide flexibility




Data shows potential effect of restrictions: TSO 1

Scatter diagram¹

x axis: initial nominations²/subscribed capacities³

y axis: definitive nominations/subscribed capacities



¹ period: 1/12/2009-28/2/2010 – 1 point equals 1 observed day behavior of 1 shipper over 1 IP (undisclosed information)



Red = downwards restriction Green = upwards interruptible


² both domestic and border-to-border transmission

x axis: initial nominations/subscribed capacities

y axis: definitive nominations/subscribed capacities



Period: October 2010 – April 2011. 1 point equals 1 observed day behavior of all shippers over 1 IP. One direction only shown.

Red = downwards restriction Green = upwards interruptible

ENTSOG supports market-based solutions

- Measures introduced by CAM NC (e.g. reservation of 10% of capacity for short term) will already lead to more available ST capacity
- Complementary, market-based CMPs (e.g. voluntary overbooking by TSOs) will also help
- Additional market-based measures (e.g. development of secondary market) may be effective in freeing up further capacity.
- A well designed oversubscription and buy-back incentive scheme could have significant benefits
 - Enable TSOs to maximise firm capacity offer above technical capacity

Market-based measures can address congestion issues without distorting shipper behaviour
