European Network of Transmission System Operators for Gas (ENTSOG) launches Stakeholder Support Process

(Brussels, 7 November 2014, PR075-14) Today the European Network of Transmission System Operators for Gas (ENTSOG) launches the Stakeholder Support Process (SSP) for the Refined Draft Incremental Proposal and the Refined Draft Network Code on the Harmonised Transmission Tariff Structures for Gas (TAR NC)

The objective of the SSP is to allow stakeholders to express their degree of support for the Refined Draft Incremental Proposal and/or the Refined Draft TAR NC which both have been amended after the consultation on the initial drafts conducted earlier this year. The Refined Draft Incremental Proposal and the Refined Draft TAR NC can be found on the ENTSOG web site.

The SSP starts today and will end Friday 21 November 2014, 13:00 CET. Stakeholders are invited to express their opinion on given sections/chapters via a respective questionnaire. The questionnaire for the Refined Draft Incremental Proposal can be found here and for the Refined Draft TAR NC here.
